



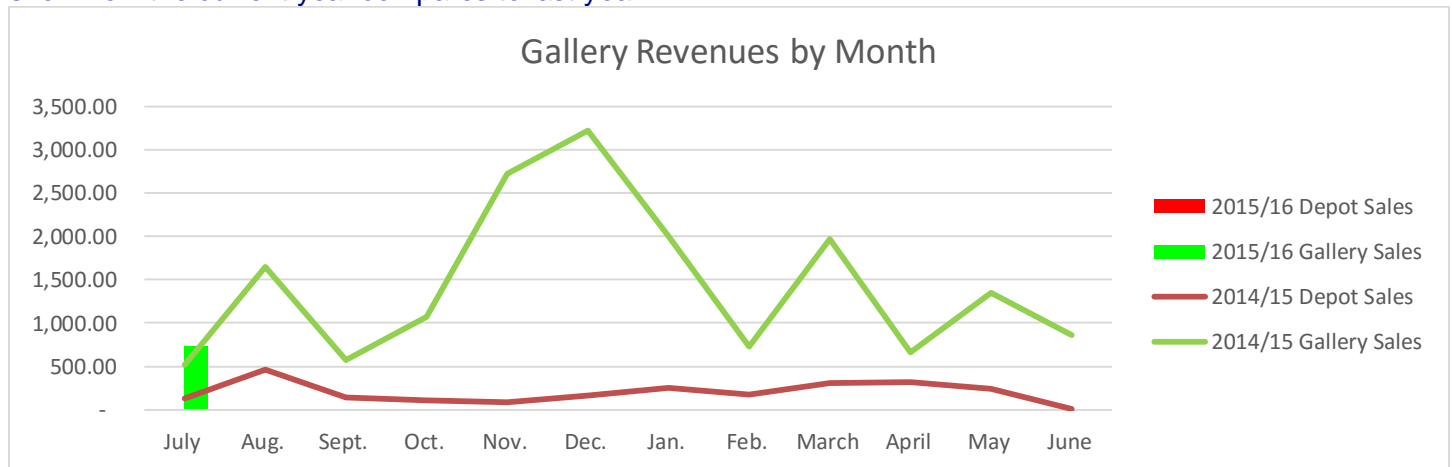

Black and White Photography Exhibit

We have an exciting show coming up. Our Black and White Photography Group wants to display all the fabulous pictures they have taken, but the rest of us don't want to be left out, so to stay with the theme, anybody that has black and white (2D) art, with a maximum of 10% color, is asked to participate.

The intake (and pick up of the current exhibit) is on Friday, September 11 from 1 to 3 PM and Saturday, September 12 from 10 to 12 PM, the display will be up until Friday, November 6 with final removal of all exhibits by Saturday November, 7 in order to have the intake for the next Judged show.

Display at the Depot

We have an opportunity for individuals to display their art at the DEPOT (Gibson Mill). There is 1 panel that has become available. The panels are "rented" to members for \$5.00/month per panel, the panels are 32" x 48", to pay for it, we use the "HONOR" system and ask you to drop your rent money in the Donation Box at the Guild, we would like to rent them for 3 month at a time.

The DEPOT has been a good exposure for us and we do want to remain at the "Brick Wall Gallery".

The panels would be controlled by the individual renting them, you decide what to hang and how long to leave it there. The labels would be the same as they are now, with the CAG inventory #, title, name, medium and price on the back and on the bottom of your art,

The commission will remain 10% DEPOT - 10% CAG.

Charter By-Laws

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

- a) To bring together a group of artists and persons interested in the advancement of the arts for educational purposes;
- b) To promote the study of art and the distribution of information concerning the arts;
- c) To stimulate contact with the arts for all ages;
- d) To encourage ownership of original works of art by offering exposure for artists to the public;
- e) To encourage the production, exhibition, presentation and disposition of pictures, drawings, paintings, sculptures, crafts, music and other objects works or designs of art;
- f) To preserve and restore, by acquisition and otherwise, artistic and historical property, real and personal, and to encourage the preservation and restoration of such property.
- g) To encourage and promote esthetic planning and care of public buildings, grounds, parks, and thoroughfares and the beautification thereof.
- h) To accept subscriptions, contributions, donations, or gifts.
- i) To make donations for the promotion of projects designed for educational and artistic development which qualify under Section 170 of the Internal Revenue Code and the regulations thereunder as the same now exist or as they may hereafter be amended; and
- j) To have all such other powers as are set forth in Chapter 55A, Article IV, of the General Statutes of North Carolina.
